




RAPID AND UNPLANNED URBANIZATION

- Small- and medium-sized cities are the fastest growing ones and concentrate most of the urban population in Africa.
- In 2018, only 221 African cities' populations exceeded 300,000 while more than 10,000 cities and towns had less than 300,000 inhabitants.
- These towns face pronounced urban planning and management capacity challenges which may also constrain COVID-19 responses.





COVID-19: Response and recovery plan

Emergency WASH, health & urban planning interventions



Ghana, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, Ethiopia, Somalia, Nigeria, Madagascar, Mozambique, Kenya, South Sudan, Tanzania

- facility and partner data collection for risk mapping in informal settlements and IDP settlements
- handwashing facilities for communal areas and poor households
- Sanitized and masks distribution
- cleaning kits, support activities and capacity
- redesign overcrowded city markets and set up of temporary markets
- Cash transfer to vulnerable households







COVID-19: Response and recovery plan

Emergency WASH, health&urban planning interventions



Somalia

- 1 Million liters of water supplied to IDPs in Hargeisa
- 100 pieces of 300L tanks donated to vulnerable households in Jimcaale and Ayaha IV IDP settlements
- 2,300 beneficiaries received their first cash transfer installment of 35 USD per household in Mogadishu
- 575 Households received 3 months cash transfer of 60 USD per household in Berbera
- 205 hand washing stations set up in Mogadishu
- Kismayo 2,200 IDP households supplied with water











WATER AND SANITATION FOR AFRICAN CITIES

- Joint UN Water and Sanitation in Disaster Prone Communities in Northern Ghana - 565 resilient & cost-effective water and sanitation infrastructure installed in Northern Region serving 270,000 people, including 55,000 school children plus 82,000 people now living in 150 Open Defecation Free (ODF) communities.
- Lake Victoria Water and Sanitation Initiative Mwanza 2,500 people from 415 households in three informal settlements of Mwanza City have benefitted from low-cost sewerage. Reprogrammed part of the funds to support Resilience, Preparedness and Response against Water Borne Diseases including pandemics such as Covid 19 in Mwanza.
- UN Kigoma Joint Programme 32, 000 people have access to clean water, including 11 public institutions. Part of the project has been reprogrammed to support COVID-19 Rapid Response Project in Kigoma.










ROAS Presence – General Facts




