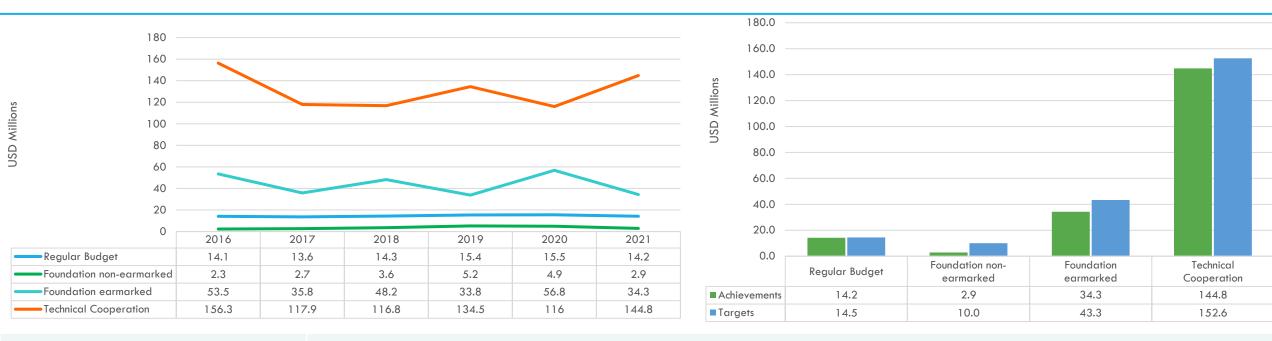

TOTAL CONTRIBUTIONS

1.6% increase income in 2021 than 2020: USD 193 million compared to USD 196.2 million

Regular Budget

UN-Habitat's allocation from assessed contributions of Member States to UN System – *** 2021 figures are interim.

Foundation Non earmarked

non-earmarked voluntary contributions for core normative activities; 2021 income only 29% of target of US2.9 million; urgent support from Member States for the budget of USD 12 million approved for 2022.

EARMARKED CONTRIBUTIONS

Increase of 3.6% for UN-Habitat's services for earmarked programmes

Foundation Special Purpose

voluntary earmarked contributions for global programmes: 39.6 % lower in 2021, reached 79% of the target

Technical Cooperation

voluntary earmarked contributions for country and regional programmes increase of 34.8% in 2021, reached 95% of target for 2021

- Take part in partnership and pledging events to increase core support

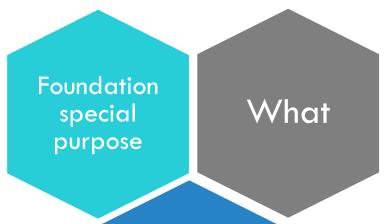
Member States' role

Challenges

- Income only 29% of budget in 2021
- 25 Member States contributed to core
- Long term decline has impact on core activities



Foundation special purpose resources



- Review and approve work programme and budget
- Share development aid strategy for your country
- Advocate for support for thematic flagship programmes
- Advocate for soft earmarked support

Member States' role

- Finances earmarked global programmes e.g. World Urban Forum, Participatory Slum Upgrading Programme, Global Land Tool Network
- 2022 budget USD 69.1 Million
- Goals: balanced and soft earmarked support for all four domains of change



Technical Cooperation earmarked resources



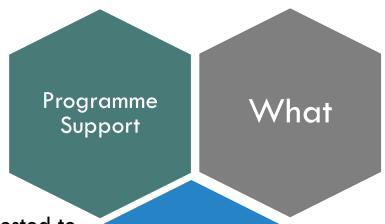
- Review and approve work programme and budget

Member States' role

- Finances earmarked regional and country programmes top supporters are European Commission and Japan
- 2022 budget USD 149.8 Million
- UN wide cooperation for high impact programmes to accelerate achievement of all SDGs in countries



Programme Support Costs



- Covers indirect costs related to earmarked projects e.g. administrative support and advocacy
 - 2022 budget USD 11.2 Million

- Member States requested to comply with UN Secretariat cost recovery policies in line with <u>UN Funding Compact</u>
- Ensures that core funds do not subsidize earmarked projects in line General Assembly Resolution

 A/RES/67/226 which requested implementation of full cost recovery
