
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


Expense mix in 2023






Trend in earmarked revenue




18 Foundation contributors thus far in 2024





Contributions by region thus far in 2024






Foundation: donor base and contribution pattern






Budget recosting: guiding principles

- ✓ A budget is a realistic spending plan that informs governing bodies prior to their decisions
- ✓ UN budgets are in US dollars, even though spending can be in any currency ➤ exchange rates
- ✓ Cost of living surveys are periodically conducted on a geographic basis ► local salaries and international post adjustments
- ✓ Staff have various benefits and entitlements ► standard post costs
- **√**₁₅ Commodity prices can also fluctuate **▶** operational costs







Budget decision

Considerations

- 1. Balance confidence with fiduciary responsibility
- 2. Healthy contributions to date
- 3. Seasonality in Q4
- 4. Recognition of the scalability concept
- 5. Motivation of contributions

Decision language

Conditionality: if revenue reaches a defined value, then package 1 is approved, otherwise the baseline



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
