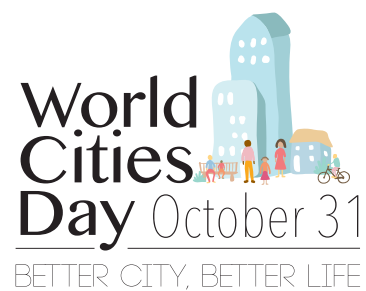

Introduction

Every October UN-Habitat and partners organize a month of activities, events and discussions on urban sustainability. In 2018 Urban October celebrations began with World Habitat Day on 1 October on the theme of *Municipal Solid Waste Management*. The global observance was hosted by the Government of Kenya in Nairobi. Urban October ended with the World Cities Day global observance being celebrated in Liverpool, United Kingdom on 31 October with the theme *Building Sustainable and Resilient Cities*. Local, regional and national authorities and partners were encouraged to organize activities and register them.

This year was the most successful Urban October on record with a total of 61 countries marking World Habitat Day and World Cities Day, and hosting events to celebrate Urban October.



World Habitat Day, 1 October 2018

World Habitat Day is celebrated on the first Monday of October. This year's theme – *Municipal Solid Waste Management* was chosen as the amount of waste produced by individuals is growing daily and often costs local authorities a large proportion of their budget. Poor collection and disposal of solid waste leads to serious health problems from uncontrolled dump sites and burning of waste. It also results in polluted air and water.

A change in public attitudes to minimize waste and stop littering, the regularization of informal waste collectors, increased recycling and reuse sufficient funding and solid waste planning including adequate landfill sites, can help cities to improve the current state of solid waste management and save money, turning them into *Waste-Wise Cities*.

Global Observance of World Habitat Day, Nairobi, Kenya

The global observance of World Habitat Day on 1 October was held at the United Nations Office at Nairobi, home to UN-Habitat's headquarters, and was co-hosted by the Government of

Kenya. In his keynote address at the global observance, President Uhuru Kenyatta of Kenya stated: "Solid waste management poses one of the greatest challenges of our time in a rapidly urbanizing world," and commended the Executive Director of UN-Habitat for her commitment and passion in addressing the challenge.

President Kenyatta presented five winners of the UN-Habitat Scroll of Honour with plaques to recognize their work in improving urban communities. The winners were: Mr. Isaac Muasa of Kenya, chair of the Mathare Environmental Conservation Youth Group, for inspiring community-wide involvement; Xuzhou City, Jiangsu Province, China, for innovative waste management; the National Action Plan for the Implementation of the New Urban Agenda in Cuba 2017-2036 by the Institute of Physical Planning; the late Dr. Mona A. Serageldin of the Institute for International Urban Development, U.S.A., for her research (award presented to her son); and the Mayor of Surabaya city, Indonesia, Tri Rismaharini for implementing inclusive city regeneration.

The Executive Director, Maimunah Mohd. Sharif announced the launch of a call for action for *Waste Wise Cities*, which was discussed further in the afternoon by a panel of experts. “This calls for cities, towns and communities around the world to rethink, reduce, recycle, refuse and reuse waste,” she said.

Other speakers during the morning session included Mr. James Wainaina Macharia, Cabinet Secretary of the Ministry of Transport, Infrastructure, Housing, Urban Development and Public Works; Prof. Peter Anyang' Nyong'o, Kisumu County Governor and Mr. Mike Mbuvi Sonko, Nairobi City County Governor while representatives from Japan's Ministry of Environment and the World Bank spoke in the afternoon. A technical discussion on *Waste Wise Cities* followed with representatives from civil

society, Nairobi City County Government, NGOs and UN agencies.

The day included story-telling, exhibitions by various Kenyan artists using trash in innovative ways and a fashion show of pieces all made from trash. The event was well covered in the media with the Executive Director taking part in a live breakfast show on the Kenyan NTV channel, two pull out spreads in *The Nation* and *The Standard*, a press conference, a large group of Chinese media who interviewed the Executive Director, a spot on Kenya's Citizen television and a feature on solid waste in Congo by Al-Jazeera featuring UN-Habitat.

Global World Habitat Day Celebrations

Some 80 cities around the world held events to mark World Habitat Day. These included:

01

Luanda, Angola:

In the Angolan capital, Luanda, it was celebrated with a conference at the Brazilian-Angolan Cultural Center (CCBA) attended by the Secretary of State for Urban and Territorial Development, architect Angela Mingas, the UN Resident Coordinator, Dr. Pier Paolo Balladeli, representatives of UN agencies in Angola and members of civil society. A project to promote urban resilience in the city's informal settlements through a system of sanitation and solid waste management was presented at the meeting.

A television Debate was organized by UN-Habitat in partnership with MINOTH, on TV Zimbo on the theme of World Habitat Day and Municipal Solid Waste Management on 2 October. Representative of MINOTH, Architect Ana Julieta, representative of the Ministry of the Environment, Mr. Karélia Costa, representative of civil society Mr. Vladimir Russo, and head of UN-Habitat Angola, architect Ana Bragança, took part in the discussion on waste management in Angolan cities, the Strategic Plan and the importance of an integrated municipal solid waste management system that involves urban planning which was chaired by Director of Foreign Affairs from MINOTH architect Ana Julieta.

Maseru, Lesotho:

The Lesotho Ministry of Local Government and Chieftainship partnered with UN-Habitat to host an Urban Breakfast in Maseru on the World Habitat Day theme of Solid Waste Management with over 50 participants including primary school pupils.

At the event, the Minister for Local Government and Chieftainship Habofanoeh Lehana, emphasized the importance of evaluating environmental awareness and called attention to Vision 2020 where "Lesotho has committed itself to keeping its waste generation rate below 150,000 tons per year, and to recovering 70 per cent of such waste by the year 2010, 75 per cent by 2015 and 79 per cent by 2020."

The Mayor of Maseru City Ms. Mpho Moloi called on participants to "all unite to keep Maseru clean - waste management is everybody's responsibility".

03

Guinea-Bissau:

UN-Habitat hosted Urban Breakfast at the Government Palace of Guinea-Bissau to validate the Bissau 2030 Strategic Plan. This was a follow-up on an activity developed by UN-Habitat Urban Planning and Design Lab in April 2018. Among 48 participants taking part in the discussions were representatives of international organizations, government agencies, and NGOs. The meeting was addressed by Minister of Public Works, Construction and Urbanism, Mr. António Óscar Barbosa Congressman Mario de Sami and Thomaz Ramalho, Marcella Guarneri and Christelle Lahoud. from UN-Habitat -

World Habitat Day was also celebrated in Guinea Bissau with a two-hour radio debate on municipal solid waste management, broadcast by two radio stations in the region of Bissau *Rádio Difusão Nacional* and *Rádio Jovem*. UN-Habitat, the Ministry of Public Works, Construction and Urbanism, the Secretary of State for the Environment, the Municipality of Bissau and the Waste Recycling Cooperative CRELIX participated in the debate aimed at sharing information about the current situation on municipal solid waste management in Bissau with the local population. The Minister of Public Works, Construction and Urbanism gave a speech on national public television and other outlets which recognized the importance of sustainable urbanization in Guinea-Bissau's development.



04

São Tomé and Príncipe:

A conference was held on 2 October involving staff members of the Housing and Real Estate Institute (IHI) and UN-Habitat. The Country Manager of UN-Habitat in São Tomé and Príncipe, Cesaltino Vaz Fernandes and the IHI Director, José Maria Barros spoke on transformations in urbanization patterns during recent years, changes in housing standards, changes in energy consumption patterns and challenges in urban sustainability.



05

Maputo, Mozambique:

World Habitat Day was celebrated on 5 October with a panel discussion in which partners from Maputo Municipality, Ministry of Land, Environment and Rural Development, JICA, and the civil society organization participated in *Let's Do It Mozambique*, a discussion on how to improve solid waste management in municipalities in Mozambique.

The panellists who included representative of JICA, Mr. Aoki Hideaki; National Direction of Environment representative Mr. Joao Cipriano,; and Director of Water and Sanitation in Maputo and of the National Association of the Waste Managers, Mr. Joao Mucavele, exchanged views in an open discussion moderated by Dinis Zacarias Dinis of UN-Habitat.

Panelists concluded that municipalities should follow the example set by Maputo and establish a legal framework for solid waste management. They recommended that waste management be budgeted for, institutional capacities and knowledge about solid waste should be developed, civil society should be engaged in education and awareness raising campaigns, and solid waste management should be included in the national agenda, including by promoting better liaison between central government and the municipalities.

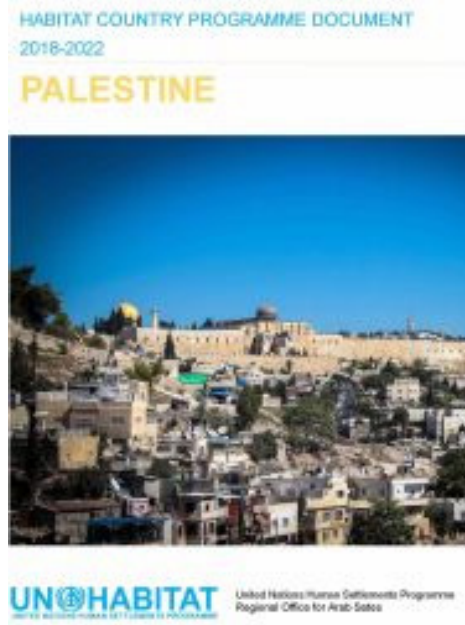
Cabo Verde:

Some 40 new urban Ambassadors were certified and joined the UN-Habitat Cabo Verde Urban Ambassadors' family. The ambassadors were selected from the arts, sports, social activism, social service, sociology, architecture, journalism, research and teaching and youth entrepreneurship

New York, USA:

1.4 million people face hunger in New York City alone while around 14 million tons of food waste costs almost \$400 million to ship to incinerators or landfills annually. A conversation between restaurant chefs and policy makers to explore and rethink food and its waste, connecting practice with policy, was organized jointly by the James Beard Foundation, FAO and UN-Habitat.

Palestine:

The UN-Habitat Country Programme Document for Palestine (HCPD) 2018-2022 was launched on 2 October.

The document will help policy makers and urban planners to analyze, design and implement interventions in sustainable urbanization, spatial planning, local governance, and urban management that are responsive to the needs of the Palestinian people. The HCPD will be implemented through the Special Human Settlements Programme for the Palestinian People (SHSPPP) which recognizes the need to be nimble and innovative by promoting multilateral and bilateral partnerships with other UN entities and development partners. The SHSPPP has been instrumental in developing a coherent spatial planning system across Palestine.

Bahrain:

UN-Habitat and the Ministry of Housing hosted a seminar on Housing Policies to celebrate World Habitat Day.

Tehran, Iran:

UN-Habitat and the Ministry of Roads and Urban Development celebrated World Habitat Day on 29 September 2018, concurrently with the eighth *Conference on Housing Policies in Iran*. Chief of UN-Habitat office in Tehran Mr. Siamak Moghaddam, delivered a keynote speech on this year's theme *Managing municipal solid waste*.

UN-Habitat Tehran Urban and Regional Planner, Ms. Sara Habibi introduced National Urban Policy and its framework at a workshop conducted by UN-Habitat on *The role of National Urban Policy in the Urban Development Process*. UN-Habitat consultant for the National Urban Policy diagnostic report, Ms. Giti Etemad presented the results of current phase of the study for discussion.

The Environment Management and Sustainable Development Center, Waste Management Organization, Tehran Research and Planning Center, Communication and International Affairs Center Tehran Municipality, and the Urban Regeneration Company of Iran partnered with UN-Habitat to commemorate World Habitat Day 2018.

A Faculty Member of the University of Tehran, Mr. Mohammad Ali Abdoli, Director of the Human and Sustainable Environment Association Ms. Mahdieh Pourshad, and a representative of the Waste Management Organization of Tehran Municipality Mr. Reza Naghavi participated in a panel discussion on solid waste management.

Representatives of the UNICEF, WFP, FAO and UNAIDS in Iran attended the WHD celebrations.

Bangladesh:

Un Bangladesh, World Habitat Day celebrations started with a Grand Rally on 1 October organized by the Ministry of Housing and Public Works (MoH&PW). The rally was launched by the Minister and attended by all heads of institutions under the Ministry and more than 700 representatives of community organizations, academic institutions, NGOs and civil society. The National Housing Authority (NHA) and the Real Estate Housing Association of Bangladesh (REHAB) supported the rally, providing promotional material including caps, t-shirts and banners.

As part of WHD celebrations, a booklet written by professionals and academics was published by the Ministry of Housing and Public Works with messages from the President and Prime Minister, the Minister and Secretary of the Ministry of Housing.

The Director-General of the Rural Development Academy Mr. Abdul Matin presented a keynote paper on Municipal Solid Waste Management and

a special thematic seminar was organized by the Urban Development Directorate (UDD). _

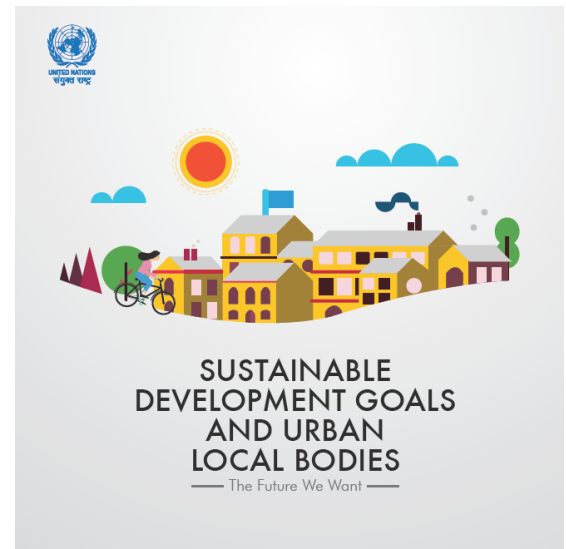


New Delhi, India:

On 1 October Hindustan Prefab Limited (HPL) and UN-Habitat organized a campaign to raise awareness among schoolchildren from marginalized communities on the importance of good solid waste management practices and the need to build sustainable habitats by keeping their environment clean.

Union Minister of State (I/C) Mr. Hardeep Puri said the *Swachhata hi Sewa* drive is an effort to involve people in the campaign by making it a *Jan Andolan* (People's movement). He emphasized that youth are the driving force behind the success of the campaign, adding that Keeping our villages, towns and cities clean is everyone's responsibility.

The Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs, Government of India and UN-Habitat, HUDCO, BMTPC, NHB and other organizations joined hands to celebrate World Habitat Day 2018 in New Delhi on 5 October. with the participation of schoolchildren, youth, government institutions, UN agencies, community organizations, the private sector and academic institutions.



UN Resident Coordinator, Mr. Yuri Afanaseiv highlighted the potential benefits of the circular economy as a pathway to solid waste management and the USD 700 billion opportunity it presents for India. Union Minister (I/C), Mr. Puri, stressed that the Government of India is prioritizing green and resilient urbanization with solid waste management as the fulcrum around which many urban schemes are built. UN-Habitat Country Manager, Mr. Hitesh Vaidya said there is need to 'rethink' waste management.

- *Sustainable Development Goals and Urban Local Bodies - The future we want*
A guidance note on actions that cities can undertake to contribute to achievement of Sustainable Development Goals prepared by UN-Habitat India was launched. A theme paper written by UN-Habitat on *Municipal Solid Waste Management and Creating Waste-wise Cities* was published in *Shelter* magazine, a HSMI HUDCO publication.
- Paintings by physically challenged children on the theme *A clean city is the nation's pride* were showcased and winners celebrated during the event.

A short video on innovation and best practice in solid waste management depicting notable achievements in *Waste to Wealth* by the city of Ambikapur, Chattisgarh was screened.

Fukuoka, Japan:

UN-Habitat and Fukuoka International Exchange Foundation organized a workshop on Municipal Solid Waste Management and SDGs in Fukuoka to mark the World Habitat Day. The workshop aimed at sensitizing citizens on the challenges of waste management and drawing attention to some ways to solve the problems of waste. The workshop was attended by Secretary-General for Japan Parliamentarians on Habitat Mr. Makoto Oniki,

Lao PDR:

UN-Habitat worked and the Department of Housing and Urban Planning in the Ministry of Public Works and Transport coordinated awareness raising activities in schools to mark World Habitat Day.

The campaign also targeted the public with Municipal Solid Waste Management awareness banners displayed in five locations across the capital city of Vientiane, and awareness campaigns and seminars being conducted in nine districts.

Yangon, Myanmar:

UN-Habitat organized World Habitat Day celebrations in Yangon on 1 October. Senior government officials, heads of UN agencies, and representatives of development agencies were among the guests who witnessed the launch of the *10 Years in Myanmar-UN-Habitat*, a publication on a decade of work and contributions made by UN-Habitat to the Government and people in Myanmar.

The UN Resident Coordinator Mr. Knut Ostby said World Habitat Day provides a unique opportunity to focus international attention on key issues surrounding sustainable urbanization, human settlements and improving urban living conditions. He called for renewal of the commitment to work together for an integrated, holistic management of the urban environment for the benefit of the people, country and the planet.

Director General U Min Htein stated that “Myanmar is committed to full implementation of the New Urban Agenda and the urban dimensions of the SDGs,” adding that “UN-Habitat has been one of Myanmar’s main partners in our attempts to ensure sustainable urban development. UN-Habitat is a valuable partner in our goal to provide sustainable and inclusive urban development, with housing for all at its centre”.

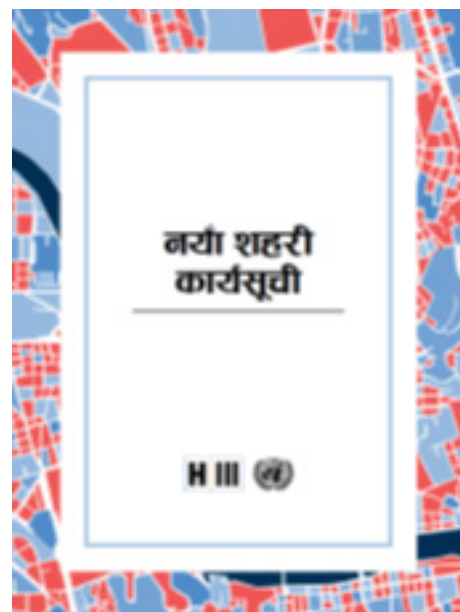

Nepal:

In Nepal, UN-Habitat organized a conference on Municipal Solid Waste jointly with the Ministry of Urban Development and 20 partner organizations from civil society, academia and the private sector. The Secretary of MoUD, Mr. Deependra Nath Sharma, Chairman of Municipal Association of Nepal, Mr. Ashok Byanju, Senior Human Settlement Officer from the Regional Office of UN-Habitat Mr. Bruno Dercon, and Joint Secretary Mr. Shivahari Sharma took part in the workshop. The Nepali translation of the New Urban Agenda was launched at the workshop.

Mayor of Waling Municipality Mr. Dilip Pratap Khand outlined positive initiatives by his municipality which has established sustainable Solid Waste Management systems and adopted 3R principles. The Project Director of DUDBC highlighted gaps and challenges in the sector and called for collective action. From the private sector, Mr. Nabin Maharjan presented the win-win situation in Kathmandu Valley where the value of waste is recognized and harvested. The programme was attended by more than 24 mayors and deputy mayors of municipalities.

UN-Habitat and Lumanti, CIUD and SABA also launched a clean-up exercise at Bungamati which will be held every Saturday. Bungamati is a heritage settlement devastated by the 2015 Earthquake. UN-Habitat and its partners are engaged in reconstruction work with the support of the SWITCH Asia Programme of the European Union.

Manila, Philippines:

UN-Habitat participated in the launch of the Green Green Green programme by the Department of Budget and Management. The programme aims to make the country's 145 cities more livable and sustainable through the development of public open spaces. Human Settlements Officer, UN Habitat Asia-Pacific Regional Office, Mr. Bernhard Barth introduced advocacy for green public spaces as a key component of global development frameworks such as the Sustainable Development Goals and the New Urban Agenda, and as a key programme of UN-Habitat. He also introduced the principal concepts behind Urban October and World Habitat Day, highlighting how Municipal Solid Waste Management, and the call to cities to become *Waste-wise Cities* impact development and maintenance of public spaces.

Islamabad, Pakistan:

Urban October 2018 celebrations in Pakistan began with a UN-Habitat organized site visit to the first Integrated Resource Recovery Centre on 1 October by the Federal Minister for Climate Change, Mr. Malik Amin Aslam, the Director-General of the Ministry of Climate Change, Mr. Irfan Tariq senior government officials, representatives of civil society, university students, and the local community.

Federal Minister for Climate Change, Ministry of Climate Change expressed his appreciation for efforts made to establish the IRRC in Islamabad and remarked that community-based waste management approaches offer a 'best solution

for cleaner Pakistan". He said that the *Clean Green Pakistan Project* is being launched to change the people's behaviour so that they would be compelled to think green. In his briefing to journalists, the minister highlighted the Centre's 85 per cent recycling rate and suggested that the model be replication and up-scaled to other areas in the country.

The Director-General presented UN-Habitat, the Akhtar Hameed Khan Memorial Trust who are managing the facility, and the National Cleaner Production Center with tokens of appreciation for their successful collaboration.

Kurunegala, Sri Lanka:

The Minister for Housing and Construction Mr. Sajith Premadasa who was the chief guest at the national celebrations opened a model village named *Jagath Nivahangama* (World Habitat Village). Mr. Premadasa told the audience of over 2,500 people that the Ministry of Housing and Construction which organized the event has been at the forefront of World Habitat Day celebrations since 1986. He expressed appreciation to all agencies and institutions for their dedication in implementing Sri Lanka's Shelter Development programme.

In her message read by Dr. Talpahewa, the UN-Habitat Executive Director said World Habitat Day provides a unique opportunity to focus international attention on key issues surrounding sustainable urbanization, human settlements and improving urban living conditions. "This year's theme - Municipal Solid Waste Management is particularly critical as the amount of waste produced by individuals, communities, businesses, institutions, markets and factories continues to grow tremendously, and tackling our waste management challenges requires imagination and innovation."

The event featured song and dance by local school children, presentation of prizes to school children for winning art and essay competitions, and presentation of house ownership documents to residents of the model village.

Hanoi, Vietnam:

UN-Habitat and the Academy of Managers for Construction and Cities organized a forum on *Innovative Technological Solutions for Solid Waste Management towards a Green and Low-Carbon Economy within the framework of Vertical Integration and Learning on Low Emission Development (V-LED) Project* supported by the International Climate Change Initiative and funded by the German Ministry of Environment.

Ministry officials, development agencies, donors, research agencies, community organizations, the private sector and city officials participated in the workshop which discussed Innovative practices in waste treatment, technological applications, and ways to strengthen local ownership and commitment.

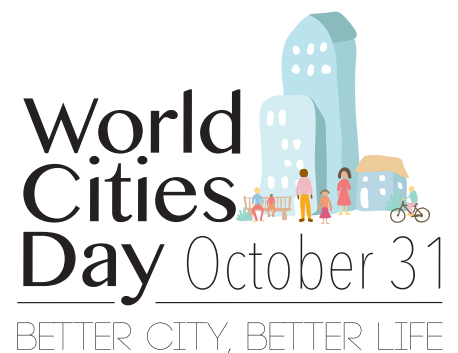




World Cities Day, 31 October 2018

World Cities Day, marked on 31 October each year, aims to promote global urbanization, enhance cooperation among countries and cities in meeting opportunities and addressing challenges of urbanization, and contribute to sustainable urban development. The overall World Cities Day theme is *Better City, Better Life* and the 2018 theme was *Building Sustainable and Resilient Cities* with the main event taking place in Liverpool, UK.

Over the last decade, natural disasters have affected more than 220 million people, causing USD \$100 billion of economic damage per year. Without significant investment to make cities more resilient, natural disasters may cost cities worldwide three times that amount a year by 2030 and climate change may push millions of urban residents into poverty. Hundreds of cities and communities are struggling with the impact of the crisis – including conflicts, natural disasters, failures in governance and economic stress.



Global Observance of World Cities Day, Liverpool, United Kingdom

At the 2018 global observance of World Cities Day in Liverpool, over 200 participants from 15 countries were in attendance, including ministers, mayors, national and local government representatives, academics, civil society, journalists and business people. The countries represented were: Algeria, Bahrain, Belgium, Brazil, China, Ghana, India, Japan, Lebanon, Mozambique, Nepal, Nigeria, Poland, UK and the USA.

Four thematic workshops took place as well as two live video link-ups to celebrations in Glasgow and the UNESCO Headquarters in Paris, and the opening of a China week exhibition for the general public. The day culminated in an evening reception and formal dinner with live music.

At the opening the Mayor of Liverpool, Joe Anderson joined the UN-Habitat Executive Director and the head of the China delegation, Ms. Tian Sainan, Deputy Secretary General, Party Committee of Urban-Rural Construction and Communication Work of Shanghai Municipality, to launch the latest edition of the *Shanghai Manual*. The UN-Habitat Executive Director read a message from the UN Secretary-General who called on everyone to work together to build sustainable and resilient cities that provide safety and opportunities for all.

The UN-Habitat Executive Director said investing in resilience was not only a human right and necessity, but also a wise investment. Distinguished speakers included the President of the Court of H.R.H. the Prime Minister of Bahrain Shaik Hussam bin Khalifa Al Khalifa and the Algeria Minister of Housing, Urban Planning and Cities Mr. Abdelwahid Temmar.

Four breakout sessions took place on different aspects of resilience – Economic (panelists from Liverpool, Accra, and Birmingham, Alabama, UK Department for International Development and University of Cardiff) Social (Brazil, Maputo, Cities Alliance, Huairou Commission), Environment (Manchester, Bahrain, Shanghai, ActionAid) and Disaster Mitigation (Sendai, Byblos, Nepal).

Liverpool also saw the celebration of China Week, Xuzhou Day and Shanghai Day.

Several Chinese journalists attended World Cities Day and local media including Radio Merseyside and nine Russian journalists were brought in by Thomson Reuters Foundation.

Global World Cities Day Celebrations

01

Guinea-Bissau:

UN-Habitat organized the *Urban October Cultural Contest*, a competition based on the SDG 11, targeting 7th, 8th and 9th grade students in public and private schools in Bissau who were asked the “What can we do to change our city?”. A manual on the rules of the contest and a poster on SDG 11 were published on social media and promoted on radio.

The classes that won worked with the local artist Ismael Hipólito Djata, helping him to present the answer to the question painted on a wall in the city centre. The three winning schools were announced on October 31 and awarded certificates signed by UN-Habitat, as well as teaching and cleaning material.

02

Maputo, Mozambique:

There was a roundtable discussion on *Building Sustainable and Resilient Cities – Coastal Cities Adaptation Project* at the Brazil-Mozambique Cultural Centre (CCBM) in Maputo to raise awareness about the importance of building more resilient cities. Discussion centred on the Coastal Cities Adaptation Project (CCAP) to increase climate resilience by incorporating climate change perspectives into planning processes in coastal cities, as well as on an affordable and accessible housing project being implemented by UN-Habitat in Pemba, Ilha de Mozambique and Quelimane.

The Vice-Minister of Public Works, Mr. Victor Tuacale emphasised the negative impact of climate change, particularly the damage to housing and water and sanitation infrastructure and services in urban areas. Noting that 60 per cent of the population is estimated to live in risk prone areas, he said implementing the New Urban Agenda and SGD 11 are at the top of the development agenda in Mozambique.

São Tomé and Príncipe

Urban Resilience and Sustainable Development Objectives were the themes of discussion at a workshop convened by UN-Habitat. Dean of Lusíada University São Tomé and Príncipe, Mr. Fernanda Pontifice, delivered a keynote address titled *My city of before and today. The session included discussions on climate action, informal settlements and slums upgrading, economic and social resilience, governance and decentralization and urban crisis.

Dhaka, Bangladesh:

The Urban Development Directorate organized a day-long thematic event on resilience to celebrate the World Cities Day on 4 November at the House Building Research Institute Campus. Twelve papers were presented on five different topics relevant to the theme. The event was attended by more than 400 participants.

10

Xuzhou, China:

The Ministry of Housing and Urban-Rural Development, the People's Government of Jiangsu Province and UN-Habitat jointly hosted the China 2018 World Cities Day national celebration in Xuzhou City on 31 October 2018. Deputy Minister of Housing and Urban-Rural Development, Mr. Ni Hong, Vice Governor of Jiangsu Province, Mr. Fei Gaoyun, and Un-Habitat Director of External Relations Ms. Christine Musisi, who represented UN-Habitat Executive Director delivered speeches at the opening ceremony.

Mr. Ni Hong noted the importance of the theme *eco-city, green development* saying that in the process of rapid urbanization in the world, many cities are facing problems of population expansion, housing shortage, air pollution and traffic congestion that restrict sustainable urban development. He stressed that China attaches great importance to urban ecological construction and green development, insists on placing ecologically livable urban construction in a prominent position, and strives to improve the quality of urban human settlements.

In recent years, Xuzhou City has practiced the development concept of *Lucid waters and lush mountains are invaluable assets* and in 2018, it won the UN-Habitat Scroll of Honour Award.

Mr. Ni Hong encouraged all cities and communities around the world to follow and actively participate in World Cities Day activities, jointly promote implementation of the New Urban Agenda, build ecologically sustainable cities, promote green development, and work together to build better cities.

In a video message introduced by Ms. Christine Musisi, UN-Habitat Executive Director Ms. Maimunah Mohd Sharif thanked the Chinese government for promoting the establishment of World Cities Day by the UN General Assembly and commended China's achievements in sustainable urban development over the past 40 years.

Other events and activities held during the 2018 China national observance of World Cities Day included the World Cities Day Forum, themed exhibitions, urban cultural exchanges and related supporting activities. Officials, mayors, experts and scholars from more than 10 countries including China, Germany, Singapore and South Africa attended the event and strengthened exchanges and cooperation and promoted urban green around the annual theme of *Ecological City, Green Development*. The development of resilience was discussed. The Chinese version of the *Shanghai*

India:

Handbook - 21st Century Urban Sustainable Development Guide 2018 Annual Report was launched at the event and the *Urban Green Development Xuzhou Initiative* was issued to global cities.



India: UN-Habitat India participated in a high-level Cities and Regions *Talanoa* Dialogues Workshop with the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEFCC), Government of India and ICLEI South Asia to mark World Cities Day. UN-Habitat Country Programme Manager, Mr. Hitesh Vaidya read the World Cities Day message from the UN-Habitat Executive Director to workshop participants.

World Cities Day 2018 was observed in India with an Urban Café on 'River for Habitat' organized by National Mission for Clean Ganga (NMCG), Ministry of Water Resources, River Development and Ganga Rejuvenation, Government of India, and UN-Habitat in a multi-stakeholder event. The Urban Café reviewed the relationship between the river and water bodies and urbanization and the urban agenda in a policy dialogue with stakeholders from academia, civil society, and local, state and central governments.

Speakers highlighted the importance of urban river rejuvenation and river basin management considering that 97 cities and towns in India are located along river banks. Water issues connect all the SDGs. A panel discussion on *River and Economy* raised the critical question on what economic benefits can be obtained from a healthy river, and explored the valuation system required to assess economic value of the river. Panelists agreed that a healthy river was vital for a healthy economy. Another panel discussion on *River and City* focused on the need for an integrated approach to city and river planning and management with long term thinking and participation from all stakeholders. "Bring environment to the heart of urban planning" was the key message from the session. The final panel discussion on *River and People* deliberated on connecting people and rivers. Identifying citizen champions and engaging communities on formalized engagement platforms was underscored as essential for maintaining healthy rivers.

The closing session highlighted there need to build the capacity of Urban Local Bodies and engage them in urban river management.

12

Hanoi, Vietnam:

The Department of Climate Change, Ministry of Natural Resources and UN-Habitat organized a *Taloana Dialogue* on urban and subnational climate actions. The National Determined Contributions of Vietnam submitted to the UNFCCC, the Plan of Implementation of the Paris Agreement, and important contributions by cities and subnational governments in achieving these targets were discussed by participants who included senior ministry officials, development partners, donors, and city representatives from Hanoi, Thanh Hoa, Can Tho City and Ho Chi Minh City.

The event provided an opportunity to showcase good practices using a *market place* technique.

Madrid, Spain:

The Sustainability Observatory presented the *Sustainable Cities in Spain 2018, according to the SDGs* Report. UN-Habitat opened the event with a presentation on World Cities Day and representatives of the Ministry of Public Works, Housing and Transport and the High Commission for the 2030 Agenda (of the Spanish Government) participated in a round table discussion.

The ETSAM-UPM (Polytechnic University of Madrid) held a lecture on the opportunity for participatory and inclusive processes for slum upgrading by Former Secretary of Housing and Urban Planning of Chile and World President of the *Latin American Service, African and Asian Popular Housing* "SELAVIP Ms. Joan Mac Donald.

Barcelona, Spain:

UN-Habitat and the Barcelona City Council celebrated World Cities Day in the community friendly Superblock or Superilla of Sant Antoni, offering activities for the whole family. Workshops were convened by AMB (Metropolitan Area of Barcelona), the provincial government of Barcelona (Diputació de Barcelona), Waters of Barcelona, Maresme Centre of Waste Treatment, Naturgy Foundation, Six Fingers, and Lavola.

Paris, France

For the first time World Cities Day was celebrated at UNESCO Headquarters in Paris with a series of urban dialogues featuring mayors from UNESCO's International Coalition of Inclusive and Sustainable Cities (ICCAR), urban specialists and artists with a live link to the global observance in Liverpool. The discussion came up with creative ideas on how local authorities and residents can take the lead in weaving the sociocultural fabric in urban spaces. This was followed by a presentation by street artists, a live drawing session by the street artist Kouka, a musical performance by the xTend hip-hop dance company and an open dance event and a graffiti wall both open to the public.

Urban October Calendar 2018

UN-Habitat and the Ministry of Housing and Territorial Development (MINOTH) organized events to mark Urban October with key partners including the Brazil-Angola Cultural Centre who were the main sponsors of Urban October activities, ULA (Lusophone University of Angola) and the NGO Development Workshop. A joint press conference on Urban October was held on 27 September and the Urban October Calendar was disseminated on broadcast and social media.

ULA'S Architecture Forum – 1 to 5 October

The Lusíada University of Angola (ULA) organized the 13th Architecture Forum under the theme *City for all* as an opportunity for reflection on the UN-Habitat mandate. For more than ten years, ULA has brought together Angola's academics and professionals. UN-Habitat's representative in Angola, Architect Ana Bragança delivered a lecture on *Sustainable Development Goal 11 and the New Urban Agenda*.

Urban Cinema In partnership with CCBA, UN-Habitat screened movies each Thursday and convened debates on issues related to life in cities. The following films were screened:

- 4 October – Aquarius - Moderated by architect Filomena of the Holy Spirit
- 11 October - Citizen Jane Moderated by architect Allan Cain
- 18 October - Big Cities Series - Rio de Janeiro: Organic Favelas and Rio de Janeiro: Women Warriors - Moderated by architects António Gameiro, Ana Bragança and Miss Miriane Peregrino;

25 October- Pelourinho in Salvador, Bahia moderated by Cristina Pinto of Kalu Association, Nídia Klein of CCBA and architect Ana Bragança of UN-Habitat.

Friday debates – Development Workshop

Angola Every Friday, the Development Workshop (DW), a UN-Habitat partner convened debates on issues related to sustainable urbanization.

The opening debate was on the theme *Transformations in the urban informal economy* with director of the DW Allain Cain delivering the lecture. A researcher at the Center for African Cities, Ms. Sylvia Croese addressed the theme *Implementation of SDGs: Challenges and Opportunities*. An investigator, Mr. António Frank spoke on *Public Security in peri-urban zones of Luanda: Cazenga Study case* and the UN-Habitat representative in Angola, architect Ana Bragança addressed the theme *Public Participation in the Urbanization Process: An Extended Conceptualization and the Use of Technology*. Each lecture was followed by a discussion.

Lecture “Art and Street: Meetings and Separations”

UN-Habitat Angola and the Brazilian-Angolan Cultural Center, in partnership with the Rui de Matos Foundation invited Brazilian artist and professor Diego Baffi to deliver a lecture on *Art and street: meetings and separations*. He discussed issues related to contemporary urban art in public spaces and presented his artistic performance as a traveling clown and as a performer on the platform *auandonde* on urban interventions in art (BR) since 2012 with performances in Brazil and 13 other countries in Africa, America and Europe.



Photographic Exhibition Modernism Luanda -

UN-Habitat Angola and the Brazilian-Angolan Cultural Center, in partnership with the Goethe Institute Angola organized an exhibition titled *Luanda's modernism*, a revisit of Hans Engels' photographs, and a reflection on the occupation of urban space through modernist architecture in the Angolan capital. The event took place at the Brazilian-Angolan Cultural Center's Gallery - CCBA.

The Reviver Campaign organized by the Center for Studies and Scientific Research of Architecture of the Lusíada University of Angola (CEICA) - ULA, and the Kalu Association aimed to educate the community on Heritage Preservation. Urban Walks were created within this framework. The *Slavery Route* is a walking tour of the old city of Luanda and the *Colonial Route* looks at architecture from the industrialization era in Luanda. This route is notable for the buildings that characterized the *duel* between the Modern Movement's Avant-garde Architecture and the Portuguese Conservative Architecture commonly referred to as the Portuguese Soft style.

University Debates

UN-Habitat and universities in Luanda jointly organized lectures on the theme *The Sustainable Development Goal 11 and the New Urban Agenda*. The Department of Technological Sciences and Engineering – DTEC at the Metropolitan Polytechnic Institute of Angola – IMETRO invited UN-Habitat representative in Angola, Ms. Ana Bragança, to deliver a lecture on *Sustainable Urban Development*

and Management of Municipal Solid Waste at the opening of the DTEC/IMETRO Technology Week..

United Nations Day – 24 October

United Nations Day in Angola was jointly organized by the Ministry of Foreign Relations (MIREX) and the United Nations in Angola. A photography exhibition showcased the work of Un-Habitat and the United Nations in Angola.



Puxa Palavra Debate

UN-Habitat and the Brazilian-Angolan Cultural Center invited architect Jaime Mesquita to interview architects Ildio Dario and Belarmino dos Santos on the theme of Urban Density. Ildio Daio was the winner of the *Imogestin* Urban Social Housing Award in Luanda in 2016 and is Head of the Urban Planning and Management Department of GTRUC.

Belarmino dos Santos was appointed advisor to the Secretary of State for Urbanism and Housing in 2011 and subsequently became Head of Department at the National Direction of Territory Planning of the Ministry of Urbanism and Housing. In 2014, he started the Building Society for Architecture.

Jaime Mesquita taught at the Lusíada University and the Methodist University of Angola and established his ObA-Office building for Architects studio in 2013. As a member of the DOCOMO Angola Installing Commission he was curator of the *Cine-esplanada Flamingo* exhibition in the city of Lobito in 2015.

Urban Breakfast in Luanda The Urban Breakfast was organized by UN-Habitat at the Brazilian-Angolan Cultural Center - CCBA. Director of Foreign Affairs from MINOTH, Ms. Ana Julieta Pereira, UN - Habitat representative in Angola Ms. Ana Bragança, Mr. Ricardo Cardoso of the Africa Center for Cities, and Director of DW, Mr. Allan Cain addressed issues related to the National Urban Forum, Implementation of the New Urban Agenda, the urban planning of Luanda, and the Informal Economy in Luanda.

Conference with Gilson Paranhos

A Conference on *Land Regularization*, was held with Brazilian architect Gilson Paranhos, President of –the Housing Development Company of the Federal District CODHAB who discussed a project located among the neediest communities in the Federal District where the local government established service stations to verify the real needs of each community.

Cabo Verde



Events included dialogues in informal settlements, national planning workshops and publicity on public television TCV and social media.

Partnerships were built with Public University Uni-CV, TCV, environmental NGO Quercus Cabo

Verde, Community Associations, primary and secondary schools, professionals and Praia City Administration in Cabo Verde's capital. Local Urban Ambassadors organized activities on urban citizenship in different cities to raise awareness about the New Urban Agenda.

Urban Walk in the City of Praia

Veteran Urban Ambassador and a member of the Order of Engineers' Bastonary, Mr. Victor Coutinho led the urban walk as the tour guide.



Technical Workshop for the National Strategic Implementation of the New Urban Agenda

UN-Habitat and the Ministry of Infrastructure, Spatial Planning and Housing convened a workshop on implementation of the New Urban Agenda in Cabo Verde attended by technicians from different public institutions, private sector and civil society.

During the three-day event, participants reviewed the implementation status of the New Urban Agenda and drew up a joint long-term vision (2016-2036) for development of a strategic plan for implementation of the New Urban Agenda.

Open Dialogue on Urban Citizenship

Urban ambassadors Elsa Furtado and Sidney Zego from the city of Calheta organized open dialogue sessions on urban citizenship with students from São Miguel High School, giving the students and a group of volunteers and educators the chance to reflect on SDG 11 on Sustainable Cities and Communities.

Urban Dialogue at Castelão

Neighbourhood – 14 October UN-Habitat and the Neighbourhood Center of Castelão convened an urban dialogue with community associations from Praia, bringing together more than 40 community associations. The dialogue was aimed at recognizing their role in the transformation of cities and communities and empowering community leaders to be peer educators and transformation agents.

During the event, UN-Habitat Coordinator, Ms. Janice da Silva handed out copies of the New Urban Agenda to each association.

Awareness Video in Partnership with Quercus Cabo Verde

UN-Habitat and Quercus Cabo Verde produced an awareness video on sustainable, safe, resilient and inclusive cities and communities which was broadcast by Programa Minuto Verde on Cabo Verde Television.

Urban Dialogue

Urban ambassadors Loide Monteiro and Victor Coutinho convened an urban dialogue with students from the Liceu Domingos Ramos School in Praia on sustainable urban development and the New Urban Agenda.

UNI-CV's Donation Delivery

UN-Habitat donated a collection of 400 publications to the University of Cabo Verde to mark two years since the HABITAT III Conference where the New Urban Agenda was adopted.

The publications cover themes such as Urban Planning, Urban Design and Spatial Planning; Urban Law, Land and Local Governance; Urban economics; Basic Urban Services; Housing and Improvement of Informal Settlements; Risk Reduction and Rehabilitation; Research and Capacity Development; Gender, Youth, Climate Change and Human Rights.

Child Friend of Environment

Urban ambassador Elizabete Bety held a workshop with 20 children from different schools in Praia to raise awareness about the importance of planting trees. Children learned the process of land preparation and the ideal way to plant trees, knowledge which will be taken back to their schools in the future.



Urban Dialogue in Água Funda

Urban ambassadors Manuela, Lourdes and Firmino who are residents of the Água Funda neighbourhood held an urban dialogue with local residents on how to improve their living conditions which was attended by UN-Habitat and local partners. EA community association is being established under the Participatory Slum Upgrading Programme.

Open Dialogue with Youth

Urban Ambassador Henrique Varela, a sociologist and personal development coach held open dialogues on urban citizenship and social skills with adolescents and adults from different neighbourhoods of Santiago island.

UN-Habitat and the Fonton community in Praia celebrated two years since adoption of the New Urban Agenda at the HABITAT III Conference in Quito, Ecuador. Ermelinda, Davia and Lucy who are community activists were certified as urban ambassadors.



A Uni-CV Geography and Spatial Planning student, Delvany De Pina won the Urban Photography Contest addressing the New Urban Agenda and SDGs organized by UN-Habitat and Uni-CV.

The university's Rector for Social Action, Student Affairs and University Culture, Mr. Mário Lima witnessed certification of the Urban Ambassadors.

Democratic Republic of Congo

UN-Habitat DRC Country Head of Programme Abel K. Walendom discussed the New Urban Agenda at a conference organized by the Congolese Society of Architects. Prime Minister Bruno Tshibala who was the keynote speaker introduced the theme *Architecture...for a better world and managing municipal solid waste*.

Guinea Bissau

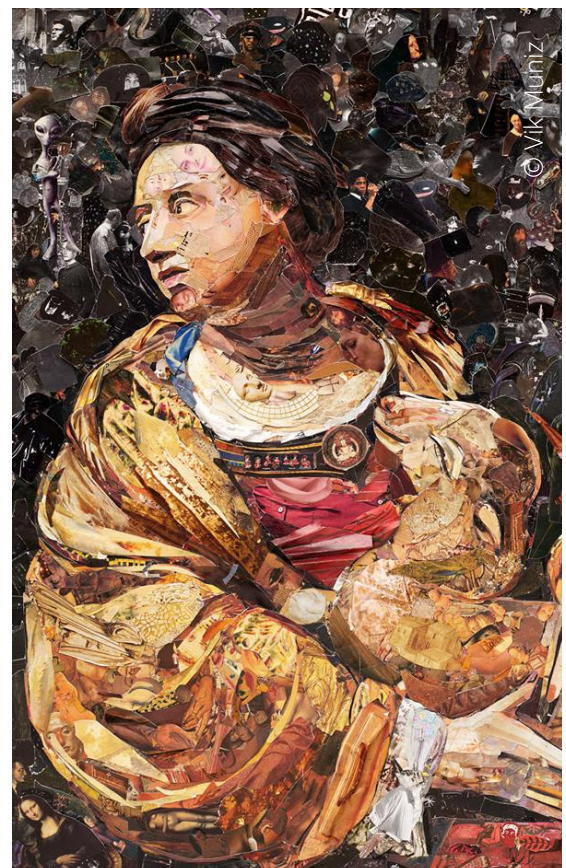
High-Level Meeting with the Municipality of Bissau

Held in the context of Urban October and validation of Bissau 2030 Strategic Plan, the meeting opened the door for a partnership between the Municipality of Bissau and UN-Habitat. Both parties agreed to sign a Memorandum of Understanding addressing priorities such as urban and territorial planning, urbanism, geographical information systems (GIS), urban mobility, cartography and cadastre systems, land management and financing instruments. Project management and implementation and mobilization of financial resources will also be covered.

Urban Cinema

The first Urban Cinema event in Guinea-Bissau featured the film *Extraordinary Waste*, a documentary that follows the work of plastic artist Vik Muniz at one of the largest sanitary landfills in the world, Jardim Gramacho on the outskirts of Rio de Janeiro. It explores the lives of those who sift through garbage for a living to produce portraits of the workers and learn about their lives. The film was followed by a debate led by UN-Habitat with participation by

four institutions that work with municipal solid waste management in Bissau - The Secretary of State for the Environment, the Municipality of Bissau, the Waste Recycling Cooperative CRELIX and the private company BLUFU.



HCPD Validation Meeting

The UN-Habitat Country Program Document (HCPD) for Guinea Bissau, a strategic document that will guide the programmes activities from 2018 to 2022 was validated at a meeting attended by General Directorates of the Ministries of Public Works, Construction and Urbanism, Housing and Urban Planning, Territorial Planning, Environment, and Regional Integration and Cooperation. The Minister of Public Works, Construction and Urban Planning

of Guinea-Bissau and the Executive Director of UN-Habitat will jointly sign the preface to the HCPD..

Urban Walk

A one-hour Urban Walk led by expert guides was a unique opportunity to experience the city, learn the history, social dynamics and urban trends of its different sites, and hear the stories behind diverse urban and architectural patrimony.

Kenya



Youth and children from various slums in Nairobi participated in a football tournament organized by UN-Habitat which also involved staff of UN agencies based in Nairobi. The Executive Director presented the winners' prizes.

Mozambique



UN-Habitat hosted two high level panel discussions with participation by politicians from central, provincial and local governments, decision makers, technical professionals in government, donors, NGOs, academia and civil society. The Mozambique Architects Association proposed convening joint training workshops during the next Urban October celebrations. The Brazil-Mozambique Cultural Centre offered to host future events.

Photo exhibition - Coastal Cities Adaptation Project

The round table discussions were followed by a cocktail party and photo exhibition in the Cultural Centre on the CCAP experience which was open to the general public.

Media presence

Two television channels promoted debates preceding the two main events organized by UN-Habitat. Two UN-Habitat experts were

invited to speak about solid waste management and resilient cities on live national TV shows. Jornal Noticias and ONU NEWS published articles on the events which were widely covered on various websites as well as on social media platforms.etc.

Rwanda

Kigali Urban Connect

The 2018 *Youth Connekt Africa Summit* in Kigali, Rwanda which ran from 8 – 10 October provided a platform for youth in Africa to learn, share information and strengthen their skills and networks. UN-Habitat hosted an inaugural Urban Youth Connekt Session 2018 which provided an urban perspective on the Summit's discussion and recommendations on developing and empowering young leaders, innovators and entrepreneurs.

São Tomé & Príncipe

Radio debate on Príncipe Island

A radio programme on solid waste management discussed increased air and water pollution and the importance of environmental education in local schools. Participants included Marta Rodrigues of UN-Habitat São Tomé and Príncipe, Plácida Lopes from the Biosphere Reserve, and Vanessa Schmitt from the Príncipe Trust Foundation.

Urban Cinema

Screening of the film *Citizen Jane - Battling for the City* was attended by representatives of the Directorate of Public Works and Urbanism and the Institute of Housing and Real Estate.

The film raised awareness about the importance of community involvement in urban planning.

Natural Beauty - Workshop

A workshop promoting the beauty of natural hair and reduction in the use of hairpieces was held with support from local hair dressers. The initiative aimed to promote awareness about the consequences of using plastic hair extensions which end up in the oceans. There are registered cases of turtles dying from ingesting plastic extensions having confused them with seaweed. Like other plastics, these extensions remain in the oceans for hundreds of years.

The HBD, the Príncipe Trust Foundation and the Biosphere Reserve partnered to convene the workshop.



Project War on Plastic

The activity consisted of creating prototype fabric bags as a means of reducing current usage of plastic bags. The fabric bags will be given to several families to promote an island without plastic. The HBD, the Príncipe Trust Foundation and the Biosphere Reserve partnered in this initiative as well.

Project Green Príncipe A series of wooden structures will be placed in garbage containers on Príncipe Island to prevent them from being damaged. To encourage sorting of waste, the containers will be labelled.



Americas



Brazil

Urban Circuit 2018

The UN-Habitat office in Brazil launched **Urban Circuit** (*Circuito Urbano*) in 2018. Responding to a public call on social networks, numerous organizations applied to host *urban events*. More than half of the proposals were selected by UN-Habitat and given visibility and institutional support.

Facts and Figures

102 events submitted, **56** events selected

28 Cities (including **15** capital cities) in **17** states, in all five regions of Brazil

30% of the event proposers were from civil society organizations, **19%** from the public sector, **19%** from private sector, **19%** from academia



Outcome of surveys carried out at *Urban Events*

- **Half of those** surveyed did not know UN-Habitat
- **48 per cent knew** that SDG 11 focuses on cities
- **19 per cent** correctly chose Quito as the city where the New Urban Agenda was adopted.

Goals of the Urban Circuit

The main purpose of the Urban Circuit 2018 was to promote events and activities related to sustainable urban development and to draw attention to the relevance of the 2018 Urban October themes *Municipal Solid Waste Management* and *Resilient and Sustainable Cities*:

- Providing visibility and broader outreach to events related to solid waste management and/or resilience.
- Strengthening the main actors in these areas and providing them with institutional support. Identifying and mapping actors in Brazil working in these specific areas.
- Facilitating development of a network of actors in these areas.
- Assessing the main problems, challenges and solutions (practices, tools and innovative approaches) identified in each event within its specific urban theme.
- Assessing the level of public knowledge about the Sustainable Development Goals, especially SDG-11 and the New Urban Agenda – and raising awareness about them.

- Raising awareness about UN-Habitat's role, mandate and activities.

Organizers were required to designate focal points to coordinate participation in the *Urban Circuit*, organize an online survey to assess public knowledge about urbanization, present a video on UN-Habitat, promote the events using specific hashtags, and complete an evaluation and reporting form.

Insights for Urban Circuit 2019

UN-Habitat Brazil is already planning Urban Circuit 2019. Due to the high levels of participation in 2018 and in order to be more aligned with Urban October, 2019 will stick strictly to the month of October.

The organizers of 14 events said they were motivated by the opportunity to be part of the Urban Circuit and many said they could have done more had they been given more time. A website for Urban Circuit is planned as a platform for information exchange and updates on timelines and agenda.



USA



Over 30 events took place in New York which were organized in partnership with partners including civil society groups, academic institutions, culinary organizations, UN member states, and UN agencies.

An Exhibition titled *Here Comes the Sun – Resilient Liverpool* was organized with Liverpool City at UNHQ in New York from 22 to 26 October as World Cities Day Global Observation took place in the city. Over 800 years old, Liverpool has an extraordinary and turbulent history. Today it is again in the middle of a renaissance, reinventing itself to ensure it is prepared for a rapidly changing future. The Liverpool Exhibition charted its story of resilience.



Arab States



Egypt



UN-Habitat and the General Organization for Physical Planning convened an expert group meeting to prepare a master plan for the city of **Ras Al-Hekma** as a resilient city supported by innovative practices, green technology and environmentally sound planning and development.

UN-Habitat also partnered with the Qalyoubiya Governorate in convening a workshop on managing urban expansion as a challenge facing cities both in the developed and developing world, and its significance and ramifications. Rapidly growing informal settlements in developing countries is the result of unplanned or poorly planned urban growth. Participants

discussed issues related to urban expansion in greater Cairo region including brief history of land readjustment in the world and case studies UN-Habitat pilot projects in Qayobia governorate, applying improvement levy in urban expansion areas, undertaking land subdivision or land consolidation, and strategies to plan expansion areas in greater Cairo region.

On 30th of October, a workshop was conducted for around 40 students from the American University in Cairo (AUC). It addressed urban problems and policies in Egypt, the role of UN-Habitat, and how interventions are aligned with SDGs and the New Urban Agenda.

Kuwait



UN-Habitat, the Municipality of Tripoli, and civil society partners carried out a clean-up of Souk El Albisah in Tripoli, Lebanon and in raising awareness about solid waste management. Shoppers were offered reusable bags in exchange for their plastic ones, with one enthusiastic lady saying, "Next time I visit the market, I'll carry this reusable bag instead of carrying several non-reusable plastic bags".

The second event featured 15 local NGOs that

advocate for sorting rubbish from the source in an exercise to familiarize locals in Old Saida with the concept. The final event was an **Urban Breakfast** at UN-Habitat premises in Beirut on the 31st of October to showcase best practices in solid waste management in Lebanon. Ali Haidar from Compost Baladi presented smart solutions for organic waste management in urban areas while Rami Assaf, from VGNI, discussed recent case studies on municipal solid waste management in Lebanon.

Saudi Arabia



The Second Saudi Urban Forum

The Saudi Urban Forum offered a great opportunity for localization of sustainable development goals. The event organized by the Ministry of Municipal and Rural Affairs (MOMRA) and supported by UN-Habitat ran from 15-17 October on the theme ***The Role of Urban Planning in Achieving Saudi Vision 2030***.

Over 70 speakers shared their expertise and

experiences with sustainable solutions and challenges working within their communities. Local authorities, experts, civil society and citizens at all levels engaged in a conversation about sustainable solutions for a better future for Saudi cities. Professionals, decision-makers and others interested in the future of Saudi cities in fields including urban planning, environment, legislation, urban management and community engagement participated.

A vibrant conversation on *New Urban Planning Trends* opened the forum. It reiterated the importance of learning from global best practices. "It is important to have a good urban plan but it is also important to have the tool to monitor this plan in the long run," said Mayor of Riyadh Region, Tarek Al Fares,

Minecraft workshop gave a group of girls and boys an opportunity to define their priorities in a local market space within Riyadh. They were able to make inclusive decisions in their planning such as including disability ramps and braille marked paths for easy navigation

by visually impaired individuals. Young Saudi women made presentations on creating parklets specific to Saudi cities using locally available materials, taking local climate into account.. One girl created an outdoor library for citizens to read and exchange books for free.

The last three decades have seen rapid urbanization and infrastructure development in Saudi cities. The Future Saudi Cities Program supports targets of the National Transformation Program (NTP) in alignment with Vision 2030 to strike a balance between preserving natural resources and economic growth.



Kuwait



Community-based organizations and NGOs were brought together in a three-day event in Abdullah Al Salem Cultural Centre (ASCC) to raise awareness about Municipal Solid Waste Management and sustainability in Kuwait through proactive strategies (such as the four Rs - Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, and Recover). The

event featured educational talks, an exhibition, and lab activities for all age groups. Recycling bins were placed permanently in different parts of the complex and pamphlets, posters, and souvenirs pertaining to conservation, waste management, and sustainability were distributed to the public.



Asia Pacific



Afghanistan



Third National Mayors Conference, Kabul.

Urban October celebrations in Afghanistan began with the third edition of the National Mayors Conference organized by the Independent Directorate for Local Government (IDLG) and the Deputy Ministry for Municipalities (DMM). The conference brought together 34 mayors for three days to discuss challenges and opportunities offered by rapid urbanization in Afghanistan. Legislative and policy developments by the Government of Afghanistan discussed at the conference include the adoption of a Municipal Law, regulation on the registration of urban informal properties, a presidential decree on land allocation for IDPs and refugees, and ongoing work on Housing and Informal Settlement Upgrading and Redevelopment policies.

Afghanistan has adopted an Urban National Priority Programme that aligns with the New Urban Agenda.

The opening ceremony of the conference was chaired by H.E President Ashraf Ghani on 1 October. The President encouraged mayors to support ongoing reforms and to strive for more productivity and less external dependence.

Afghan cities are already contributing half of the national GDP.

In line with the spirit of Habitat III, Deputy Minister of Municipalities, Mr. Abdul Baqi Popal reiterated the importance of coordination mechanisms between national and local governments. This was followed by a series of discussions by key stakeholders of the urban sector: Ministry of Housing and Urban Development; the Afghanistan Land Authority; Kabul Municipality; Provincial Municipalities; academia; civil society; donors and international partners including UN-Habitat.

During the conference, UN-Habitat screened a [promotional video](#) showcasing Afghanistan as a successful model in implementing the New Urban Agenda with specific reference to its role as technical advisor to national and local governments through six different programmes.

UN-Habitat also led a session on the Sustainable Development Goals with an emphasis on SDG11 and other urban-related SDGs, highlighting existing linkages between the government's actions and the SDG indicators of achievement.



Bangladesh

On 4 October, Bangladesh Institute of Planners organized a day-long seminar. Planners from different agencies and local government institutions attended the seminar. Papers related to the theme of World Habitat Day were presented by several professionals.

Urban Thinkers Campus: Implementation of New Urban Agenda – Grassroots Voice, Dhaka

The Participatory Development Action Program and the Coalition for the Urban Poor jointly organized a two-day Urban Thinkers Campus to raise awareness about the New Urban Agenda at the grassroots. Six sessions were conducted on different thematic areas

and key note presentations were followed with discussions at every session. The inaugural and closing sessions were attended by about 200 participants, representing poor communities, local government, academic institutions and civil societies.

Printing and distribution of New Urban Agenda: Bengali Version

The New Urban Agenda has been translated and printed in Bengali with support from UN-Habitat and other partners. More than 500 copies were distributed to the key stakeholders during the Seminar and World Cities Day event.

Fiji

Fiji Resilient Informal Settlements Workshop, Suva

UN-Habitat held a stakeholder workshop in Suva, Fiji, involving the Ministry of Housing and Community Development, the NGO Live and Learn Environmental Education and volunteers from the University of the South Pacific and the Peoples Community Network. The workshop marked the end of the household survey of 16 informal settlements in Fiji under a new programme on urban informal settlements resilience funded by the

Adaptation Fund.

Participants shared their experiences and made recommendations on approaches to enhancing resilience in informal settlements. The survey itself was a way of raising awareness about climate change within the communities. The workshop endeavoured to capture the gender (men, women, gay and transgender) perspective both on the approach for community survey and for vulnerability and gender-based special needs.

India

UN-Habitat and the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA) of the Government of India and other knowledge partners organized a month of activities, innovative events and discussions on urban sustainability.

The dialogues and discussions were held with a diverse group of stakeholders including students, youth and children, sector media

experts, academicians, elected representatives, bureaucrats, professionals from private sector, civil society and the government officials.

National Workshop on Mainstreaming Sustainable Social Housing in India Project

The National Workshop on Mainstreaming Sustainable Social Housing in India Project (MaS-SHIP) was convened in New Delhi on 9 October.

The objective of the project is to mainstream resource and energy efficiency into the development of social housing projects in India. The multi-stakeholder workshop presented findings of research by UN-Habitat, Oxford Brookes University, The Energy and Resources Institute (TERI) and Development Alternatives.

Components of the main product of the project – A Decision Support Toolkit (DST) were presented by different speakers. The DST – an interactive web-based toolkit assists construction actors ranging from local governments to developers to select sustainable building materials and construction technologies. It also assists users to adopt better design and construction practices.

The need for innovative interventions to improve sustainability of rapid housing construction was stressed as participants agreed on the value of the DST, making suggestions to improve how it measures and compares building materials.

National Workshop on Making Livable Cities: Challenges and Way Forward

UN-Habitat and TERI jointly convened a national workshop on making cities livable, as a means of contributing to a national urbanization policy. The workshop was the culmination of a series of Regional Policy Dialogues organized by TERI across the four geographical regions of India on urban planning and governance, infrastructure development, environmental sustainability and strengthening partnerships for livable cities.

The half-day events brought together multiple stakeholders, ranging from Municipal Commissioners and Smart City SPV CEOs to civil society organizations to discuss key aspects of enhancing livability in India, smart urban solutions to achieve the New Urban Agenda, and the SDGs.

UN-Habitat India participated in the panel discussion on *Partnerships to enhance livability of cities* which deliberated on how partnerships between –communities, public and private sectors, and international development partners can be built upon to enhance livability in cities.

Iran



The first Brainstorming Workshop on Implementation of the International Guidelines on Urban and Territorial Planning

The first Brainstorming Workshop on *Implementation of the International Guidelines on Urban and Territorial Planning* was held at the Ministry of Roads and Urban Development in collaboration with the Ministry of Roads and Urban Development. It introduced the general framework and objectives of UN-Habitat's *International Guidelines on Urban and Territorial Planning* (IG-UTP) and collaboration

possibilities with partners.

Scientific Workshop on Resilience for All

To commemorate International Day for Disaster Reduction, Tehran University of Medical Sciences and UN-Habitat, UN OCHA, Iranian Red Crescent Society, Tehran Disaster Mitigation and Management Organization, UN ESCAP, and the Asian and Pacific Centre for the Development Disaster Information Management convened workshop on *Resiliency for All*. UN-Habitat representative Mr. Mehmet Emin Akdogan spoke on Resiliency from a broader perspective.

Japan (Fukuoka)

Urban October Exhibition and World Habitat Day Workshop

Urban October Exhibitions were held at Fukuoka City Hall from 3- 5 October and at the lobby of Fukuoka Prefectural Government Building from 22- 31 October 2018. Both exhibitions aimed to raise public awareness about UN-Habitat and Urban October.

Children's Drawing Contest

During Urban October, UN-Habitat's Regional Office for the Asia Pacific Region and its local partners in Fukuoka organized the annual Children's Drawing Contest on the theme *Our City and Water* inviting submissions from elementary school children in fourth to sixth grade in schools from different Asian countries. The selected drawings were exhibited in Fukuoka City and are being used in the 2019 Habitat Original Calendar to be used to solicit financial support for *Water for Life* projects in the region through Fukuoka Habitat Institute.



The Gold Prize winner this year was Mr. Kennard Alvaro Hadinata, a grade 5 student from the city of Surabaya, Indonesia, who submitted a drawing and the following short essay:

"My city Surabaya is a port city and the capital of East Java. It has many parks with water features, among them is the garden surrounding our Balai Kota, which is also my favorite place to have some splashy fun. The river Kalimas flows through the city and helps provide electricity via mini power plants all over town. On this river there's an old water gate called Jagir which has been in operation since 1920s and today the area serves as fishing feature. Another thing that our city is proud of is the Mangrove Forest Ecotourism. Mangrove forest help protects the soil from water erosion and is home to over 30 protected species of animals. Within this year, our city has won four awards: The Lee Kuan Yew World City Prize (Special Mention), UN Global Green City, UNESCO Learning City, and the ASEAN Tourism 2018. Our mayor Tri Rismaharini paraded the awards throughout the city to encourage us to take better care of our city and our world."

Pakistan



Launch of *Clean and Green Pakistan* Programme, Islamabad

The *Clean and Green Pakistan* campaign was launched at Saidpur Village Islamabad on October 13, 2018 as part of the call by the Prime Minister for a *Clean and Green Pakistan* announced on October 8, 2018. The cleanliness campaign in Saidpur Village was jointly organized by the Ministry of Climate Change, UN Habitat, the Water Supply and Sanitation Collaborative Council (WSSCC), Metropolitan Corporation Islamabad (MCI), Dr. Akhtar Hameed Khan Memorial Trust (AHKMT), and National Cleaner Production Centre (NCPC) in collaboration with the Chairman of the Union Council, Saidpur.

Advisor to the Prime Minister on Climate Change and the focal person for the *Clean and Green Pakistan* Mr. Malik Amin Aslam, was the chief guest. Ambassadors of Netherlands, China, Kenya, Libya, Algeria, Tunisia, Morocco and Sudan participated. The Minister reiterated

the Government of Pakistan's commitment to improving solid and liquid waste management, sanitation and hygiene through community-based collective behaviour change. He added that the Government intends to develop Saidpur Village into a model clean and green village and a centre of attraction for international tourists and visitors. He expressed gratitude to UN-Habitat and other partners for helping to set up an Integrated Resource Recovery Centre in Saidpur Village.

Other activities included a cleanliness campaign was led by community members, government and local sanitary workers, and involving the dignitaries present, awareness raising about the importance of hand washing, a campaign against open defecation and improvement of toilet facilities. A painting competition was held, reinforcing the pride and the sense of personal responsibility towards the cleanliness drive among the school children who received their prizes from the chief guest.

Philippines



Forum on the *Abridged National Urban Development and Housing Framework*

A Forum on the Abridged National Urban Development and Housing Framework (NUDHF) provided the context for United Architects of the Philippines' (UAP) celebration of World Architecture Day with the participation of national partners. The Abridged NUDHF was presented the Director of the Policy Development Group, Housing and Land Use Regulatory Board, Ms. Nora Diaz. Angel Aguila of the Housing and Urban Development Coordinating Council, Director of the National Economic and Development Authority, Mr. Remedios Endencia Bernhard Barth of UN-Habitat Regional Office for Asia and the Pacific, and Mr. Jonathan Manalad of UAP. The forum was moderated by Country

Programme Manager, UN-Habitat Philippines Mr. Christopher Rollo.

Mindanao Urban Peace Debates, Iligan

The Mindanao Urban Peace Debates, held in partnership with the MSU-IIT Debate Varsity at the MSU-IIT campus in Iligan City, Mindanao, was a collegiate debate tournament on post-conflict and development-themed urban issues with university debate societies across Mindanao invited to participate.

The event was an advocacy platform for dialogue on peace and development in urban societies recovering from armed conflict, enabling participants to gain a stronger awareness of the normative discourse in rebuilding cities and towns damaged by

violent conflicts, have a nuanced appreciation of the complexities and sensitivities of rebuilding Marawi City within the context of larger regional conflicts, and recognize the role of young people and the academia in shaping the community and national conversations on Marawi rehabilitation.

About 50 youth participants, comprised of the 12 debate teams, judges, adjudicators, and organizers from MSU-IIT attended the two-day event with majority of them coming in from different cities and provinces.

The youth perspective on a range of urban issues contributed to understanding how the youth view risks and opportunities in urban communities facing threats of armed conflict.

An open forum followed the elimination rounds, with a panel offering insights on whether justice is better served by truth and reconciliation commissions rather than seeking prosecution for atrocities in societies rebuilding from conflict; and whether ethnic integration in housing policies and projects should be heavily promoted in societies rebuilding from conflict, the first two topics debated..

Manila Urban Debates, Manila

UN-Habitat Philippines rounded off Urban

October activities on October 28 with the Manila Urban Debates held at the Ateneo de Manila campus in Quezon City, in partnership with the Ateneo Debate Society.

Topics were selected from a list on climate change in the context of cities and equitable urbanization proposed by youth representatives.

As with the Mindanao debates, the Manila leg used the British Parliament format, and topics were only disclosed to debaters 15 minutes before each round. To shed professional insight on the points raised during the debates, an open forum was held on the first two topics, whether or not gated communities should be abolished; and whether countries with limited resources should focus on climate change adaptation rather than mitigation.

The Manila Urban Debates culminated in a championship round on the topic of whether or not to support a household-level carbon tax with La Salle Debate Society and the UP Manila Debate Circle supporting household-level carbon tax and two teams from the Ateneo Debate Society opposing it.

The Ministry of Housing and Construction organized a series of events to celebrate Urban October including special programmes targeting children, youth, women and elders.

Thailand

Urban October 2018 events in Bangkok

Since 1996, a petition addressed to the UN Secretary-General has been sent each year to the United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (UN ESCAP) and UN-Habitat by the **Four Regions Slum Network** (FRSN). Acting as an umbrella organization for several networks across Thailand, the FRSN has been vocal in advocating for the rights of the poor through protests and demonstrations to campaign for land reforms, tenure security and wider civil rights issues. With support from the Community Organizations Development Institute (CODI) under the Ministry of Social Development and Human Security (MSDHS) of the Royal Thai Government, the FRSN represents some of the most vulnerable populations in Thailand.

At a gathering of several hundred inhabitants of slums and informal settlements from across Thailand On 2 October, the President of FRSN, Ms. Varind Damrongphan called for the United Nations to act on the issue of homelessness and to alleviate the suffering of those in need by providing living spaces and building a sustainable community.

On 10 October a seminar was organized by the National Housing Authority (NHA) under the MSDHS to address challenges related to municipal solid waste management in Thailand - building upon the WHD theme. As highlighted during the seminar, many municipalities are lack the capacity to handle a formal waste management system, leading to the emergence of alternative ways to handle, manage and dispose of waste, including informal waste activities.

As part of the official observance of World Habitat Day and World Cities Day, a commemoration event involving over 300 participants was organized by UN ESCAP, UN-Habitat, the Royal Thai Government and Asian Coalition for Housing Rights on October 12 at the UN Conference Centre. Sharing details of the

20-Year National Housing Development Master Plan, the event featured opening remarks by the Minister of Social Development and Human Security, General Anantaporn Kanjanarat, an exhibition of works by CODI and the launch of Canal Housing Project in Thailand.

Awards were presented to individuals and organizations in recognition of their work in ensuring that social benefits reached their communities. A panel discussion on the **Building Sustainable and Resilient Cities** saw participation by grassroots and community leaders from over 10 countries in the Asia-Pacific region affiliated with the Slum/Shack Dwellers International (SDI) Regional Alliance.

To address the issues of waste management along with sustainable consumption and production, over 200 young people from the Global Shapers Community across the Asia-Pacific region gathered at the Regional SHAPE APAC event in Bangkok. Featuring a specialized track on **Sustainable Cities** a discussion on urban resilience was followed by an interactive game conducted by the Faculty of Architecture and Planning at Thammasat University.



Europe



The Russian Federation



The Circular City – The City as an Ecosystem for Green Businesses

UN-Habitat took part in an Urban October session within the framework of the *Open Innovation Forum - 2018* in Moscow. Launched in 2012, the Open Innovation Forum is the premier international platform in Russia for entrepreneurs, corporations, scientists, and government officials to discuss emerging global technical challenges from the technological, managerial, and humanitarian perspectives.

Mr. Nicolas Buchoud of the consultancy firm *Renaissance Urbaine*, working with UN-Habitat presented the *Circular Economy* concept and highlighted the theme of 2018 World Habitat

Day - *Municipal Solid Waste Management*.

The Deputy Minister of Construction, Housing and Utilities, Mr. Andrei Chibis informed participants that in 2019 a special programme would be launched in Russia to improve waste recycling while ensuring maximum extraction of secondary resources by creating an effective and sustainable infrastructure for garbage separation, collection and disposal.

Spain



Urban October in Spain was celebrated with the collaboration of 27 key partners and stakeholders including national, regional and local governments, professionals, the private sector, academia, UN agencies, funds and programmes, and NGOs. The Ministries of Public Works, Housing and Transport, Foreign Affairs and Territorial Policy and Public Function, as well as the European Union, the High Commissioner for the 2030 Agenda of the Spanish Government, the City Council of Cordoba and the City Council of Barcelona were among partners who supported Urban October 2018. The UN-Habitat Office in Madrid was involved in 12 Urban October events.

Living with Trash

To celebrate World Habitat Day, the ETSAM-UPM (Polytechnic University of Madrid) organized an exhibition of photos provided by the public from 25 September to 4 October. There was also a roundtable discussion on

solid waste management which included Head of UN-Habitat Office in Spain, Ms. Carmen Sanchez-Miranda and representatives of ICHaB and Asociacion Miogas, among others.

1st Yearbook of Circular Economy in Spain

The Sustainability Observatory presented its 1st Yearbook of Circular Economy in Spain showing 30 indicators on solid waste management and the circular economy. UN-Habitat opened the event with a presentation on World Habitat Day, and representatives of ECOEMBES, SIGAUS, SIGNAUS, and of the Regional Government of Extremadura participated in a roundtable discussion.

1st Urban Planning Conference

- The National Institute of Public Administration (INAP) held a two-day conference on the Local Urban Agenda and the New City Model with Ms. Carmen Sanchez-Miranda delivering a lecture on the Urban Dimension of the SDGs and the

New Urban Agenda. Representatives of the Minister of Public Works, Housing and Transport, academics, professionals, and local government officials participated.

Engendering Urban October: Integrating gender in large urban regeneration operations

The UNESCO Chair of the Polytechnic University of Madrid (UPM) discussed the gender perspective in development of large regeneration projects and urban conversion in Europe and participation, inclusion and social commitment in big urban operations. 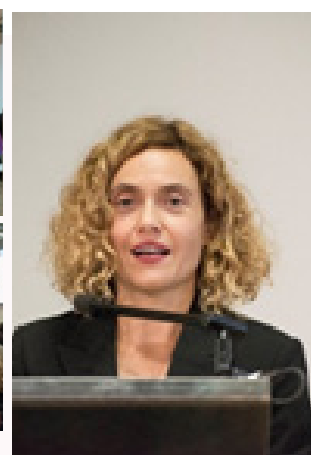

Media reports on World Habitat Day, World Cities Day and Urban October

Urban October presents UN-Habitat a unique opportunity to engage with the global community around specific messaging. This also results in a lot of outreach on social media and news distribution outlets. UN-Habitat's net tonality trended upward and was overall neutral. Media monitoring shows that there was an approximate number of editorial views reaching 48.4 Million. This is also marked with an increase of editorial mentions by 1000.

UN-Habitat under urban October campaign hashtags garnered a total of 13400 mentions which had a reach of 175 Million. Twitter accounted for 90% of social volume followed with Facebook at 5% share. 144 countries were interacting with UN-Habitat messaging in this time period. Over 4000 people interacted with the first World Habitat Day post on social media while World Cities Day inaugural post had a volume reach of over 17,000 with a positive response.
